The Apache No. 2 Mining District is near the Apache Hills in southwest New Mexico. It is a relatively famous district but perhaps its most famous mine was a copper mine known as the Apache. The district is remote and the nearest town in Lordsburg which is about 50 miles to the northeast, the nearest town with services is

Hidalgo county has 11 mining districts but 90% of all production, according to the New Mexico Geologic Society, is from 3 mines near Lordsburg. The primary mineral is copper with gold and silver being byproducts of copper mining. A sample pulled from the tailings, shown below, shows good copper.

Access to the mine is by 4wd on gravel roads. There are several shallow washes which require some clearance. The last mile to the claim is a bit brushy.

The LIDAR image shown to the left shows multiple sites within the claim which may be shafts or prospects. It's also possible you may be able to use the water at the bottom of the vertical shaft for mining purposes.
